

Dear Managers,

Asymptomatic testing - targeted at 'critical workers' who cannot work from home.

I am writing to let you know that the council has been working closely with our partners in the health service to set up three local COVID-19 asymptomatic (symptom-free) targeted testing centres for 'critical workers' who cannot work from home.

As the Director of Public Health for Bolton, I have identified staff at your organisation as a priority group to be included in this programme. Priority groups have been identified where there are 'critical workers' who cannot work from home. We are using the Government's definition of 'critical workers' which was recently updated. ¹

This testing programme will help to identify people who are not displaying any coronavirus symptoms but who may still have the virus and could therefore pass it, unknowingly, to colleagues and others. The sites have been established to help test 'critical workers' unable to work from home, to protect your workforce and ensure business continuity in vital services.

The testing sites, established, will use Lateral Flow Device tests (LFD) to provide results rapidly without the need for laboratory equipment. This means that the sites will have the capacity to conduct hundreds of tests a week.

Who can be tested?

This is an asymptomatic programme (symptom-free) for 'critical workers' unable to work from home in your organisation and not for your staff who are able to work from home.

If you or your staff are displaying **any symptoms** of coronavirus, however mild, including a new, persistent cough, high temperature or loss of normal taste or smell, you must **not** turn up to any of the asymptomatic testing sites and should instead book a test through the normal process via the [gov.uk website](http://gov.uk).

Further information about the testing programme can be found in the FAQs. Once you have expressed an interest we will make available some FAQs that can be shared with your staff.
